### 2015 Safety Olympiad

At the 29<sup>th</sup> annual Safety Olympiad held in early July in Elko, Nevada, teams from twelve mines in the states of Nevada, Wyoming and Utah were tested on their confined-space rescue, firefighting, high-angle rope rescue, first aid, triage and hazardous material handling skills. A simulated accident on the mine site involving multiple vehicles, patients and explosives in a mining blast pattern were prominent features of this year's event. Newmont's Phoenix team won the Fire Scenario category and Newmont's Carlin Team placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Triage Scenario, and was also named third overall best performer among their competing group of 6 mines. Congratulations to these teams for their hard work and commitment to safety!
